



Distinguishing between Title Series:

	Geographic Reputation Requirement	Scholarship Requirement
	<u>Clinical Professor title series:</u> Emphasizes impact at the institutional and local level through scholarly activities that derive from and support clinical service, program development, educational leadership, and/or research. <u>Professor title series:</u> Garners a reputation beyond the University. Emphasizes scholarship and peer recognition at the statewide, regional, and/or national level.	<u>Clinical Professor title series:</u> Scholarship is broadly defined. Peer-reviewed publications <u>are not</u> required. <u>Professor title series:</u> Expected to play an active and sustained key role in a program of scholarship in an area of expertise. Traditional outputs of scholarship (e.g., peer-reviewed publications) <u>are</u> required.
Promotion to Clinical Associate Professor	<u>Institutional</u> and <u>local</u> reputation	Evidence of participation in scholarly activities that derive from and support clinical service, program development, educational leadership, and/or research.
Promotion to Clinical Professor	<u>Institutional</u> and <u>local</u> reputation	Evidence of sustained, active engagement in scholarly activities that derive from and support clinical service, program development, educational leadership, and/or research. Peer-reviewed publications are <u>encouraged</u> .
Promotion to Associate Professor	Emerging <u>regional</u> or <u>statewide</u> reputation	Evidence of track record of strong trajectory of scholarly achievement , including ~10 peer-reviewed publications reflected in peer recognition of works from original research, clinical observations, educational programs, etc.
Promotion to Professor	Sustained <u>regional</u> or <u>statewide</u> reputation and <u>emerging national</u> reputation	Sustained scholarly achievement including ~20 peer-reviewed publications reflected in peer recognition of works from original research, clinical observations, educational programs, etc.
